

Fund commentary

Global share markets fell sharply in February, with the MSCI World Index - Net closing the month down 4.9% in unhedged AUD terms. In hedged AUD terms the index returned -8.4%. Share markets actually began the month positively, with stocks rising on speculation a coronavirus-related slowdown in China would likely be transitory in nature rather than structural, better-than-expected US and European manufacturing data and news US consumer sentiment hit a two-year high in February. However, share markets' early gains were wiped out entirely toward the end of the month amid fears the rapid spread of coronavirus outside of Mainland China could lead to an economically devastating pandemic. Australian shares were also significantly lower for the month; the S&P/ASX 300 Accumulation Index falling 7.8% on the back of rising coronavirus fears, weakness across the major banks and miners and a jump in January's unemployment rate to 5.3%. This was up on the 5.1% recorded in December. Elsewhere, global bonds made good gains in February, with the Bloomberg Barclays Global Aggregate Bond Index up 1.2% in hedged AUD terms. Australian bonds underperformed their global counterparts over the period but still managed to post positive absolute returns, with the Bloomberg AusBond Composite 0+ Year Index returning 0.9%. The domestic cash market returned 0.1%.
